## Top tips in education: Identifying Young Adult Carers

Signs to look out for:

- Often late or miss days for no apparent reason?
- Tired, withdrawn or finding it difficult to concentrate?
- Few or no friendship circles?
- Isolated and bullied?
- In contrast, they may be over confident with adults?
- Under-achieving or disorganised? Coursework late or not handed in
- Behavioural problems?
- Low mood or seem depressed?
- Secretive about home?

## Top tips in education: Supporting Young Adult Carers

## Ways in which tutors can help:

- Learn to understand the caring role and the barriers it creates
- Raise awareness of young adult carers amongst other students
- Provide a trusted staff member who can be spoken to in confidence
- Understand lateness or needing to leave early
- Respect privacy; too many questions can be upsetting
- But don't shy away from asking 'are you okay?' giving the chance to talk
- Provide access to careers advice tailored to take into account caring roles
- Provide information on **financial grants** to help with transport, equipment or food
- Fundraising for young adult carers would help raise awareness
- Allow carers to keep a **phone on** in lessons if that would reduce anxiety
- Know that Carers' Resource can offer support to tutors as well as carers

# Top tips in education: Supporting Young Adult Carers

## Ways in which schools & colleges can help:

- Provide appropriate training to staff including the barriers faced by young adult carers
   and how to identify them
- Identify a 'Young Carer champion' a member of staff accessible by staff, students and families as a key point of contact
- During the **enrolment process**, ask 'do you provide unpaid care?' This is a discreet method of encouraging early identification
- Provide other appropriate opportunities for carers to self-identify
- Publicise information about available support internally & externally
- Ensure policies prevent bullying and stigma for young adult carers
- Educate other students on the roles of young adult carers and where they can be signposted for support
